

### STAFFING NEWS

### ROYAL COMMISSION UPDATE

The Royal Commission held its final public hearing for the year in Canberra last week, inquiring into the interface of aged care with the health system. In particular, the focus was on the ability of residents in residential aged care to access primary and specialist healthcare.

#### These key propositions are:

That there should be funding to establish the nationwide implementation of hospital-led multi-disciplinary teams to deliver outreach programs to residential aged care residents.

That a new method of primary care funding be developed to better incentivise General Practitioners to service aged care residents.

That practical and logistical barriers be broken down to give further incentive to General Practitioners to service aged care residents.

That both financial and cultural barriers that prevent medical specialists from attending aged care facilities be broken down.

That aged care providers be required to work with families and residents to help them develop informed and comprehensive advanced care planning directives.

## LEADING AGED CARE SERVICES AUSTRALIA

### **Peak bodies unite in pre-Christmas warning to avoid New Year aged care emergency, Dec 2019 (extract from article written by Sara Byers on behalf of LASA)**

Australia's largest aged care provider representatives have united in a pre-Christmas appeal to the Federal Government, to avoid an aged care emergency in 2020.

Aged and Community Services Australia (ACSA), Anglicare Australia, Baptist Care Australia, Catholic Health Australia, Leading Age Services Australia (LASA), The Aged Care Guild and UnitingCare Australia have joined together to urge Government to use the Mid-Year Economic and Fiscal Outlook (MYEFO) to address the immediate risk to senior Australians and support this vital industry to transition through the Aged Care Royal Commission process.

We recommend the Government's prompt commitment to key issues raised by the Royal Commission's interim report but the areas addressed are only the tip of the iceberg and the package announced is insufficient to support senior Australians today.

We are working and standing together to ensure every older Australian in need receive the highest quality of care, without failure.

The fact is, without further investment, residential facilities – and associated home and community care services – will be lost in the next twelve months.

With around 50 per cent of facilities operating at a loss, industry analysis suggests that there are nearly 200 providers with up to 50,000 beds at an unacceptably high level of financial risk.

Around 15 per cent of providers have reported that they may need to close services in the next 12 months if circumstances do not improve.

Let us hope that these issues are addressed in 2020.





## Leave more than memories behind.

#### General Legacy.

(Insert your gift amount. This can be an amount of money,  
a percentage or portion of your estate,  
a property or other specific items).

**to be used by the Home in support of the care and ministry to aging local people  
residing in this Home, owned by the Lutheran Church of Australia, South Australia/  
Northern Territory District.**

### Some points to remember when making your Will:

- As a Christian, remember that everything you have comes from God. Your Will is a final way of showing your love and thanks to Him for all the blessings you have been given in your lifetime. Consider a Christian preamble to your Will.
- Your Will should make fair provision for your immediate family. This will help to avoid future legal challenges.
- Keep your Will flexible by allowing for future events. You should recognise that one or more of your beneficiaries may die before you or at the same time. Make sure that a final beneficiary is named to receive the residue of your estate.
- Provide for the effects of inflation. The value of amounts you nominate today will change over time. Use portions (e.g. 1/8, 1/2, 1/4 etc) or percentages (10%, 20%, 50% etc) in distributing your property and money and this will overcome the effects of inflation.
- In thanks to God, consider naming Tanunda Lutheran Home as a beneficiary in your Will. Legacies provide valuable help to ensure Christian care continues for those who have contributed so much to our way of life here in the Barossa Valley.

## THANK YOU Dorcas Kernich

Dorcas has been an independent living resident at TLH since 2007—she moved to TRL from their previous residence in Tanunda with her late husband Pastor Eric Kernich. Just about everyone at TLH and TRL knows Dorcas! Dorcas is one of many wonderful volunteers who serve our community—but few have served in the multitude of ways that she does. Dorcas’s volunteering days are not over, but she has decided to take a break in a couple of key areas—TIT TAT and as the representative for Hilda Schulz Drive.



The name “Dorcas Kernich” has been synonymous with TIT TAT for eight years - since 2011, when she took over the publication’s editorship from Pastor Graham Maas. When asked to reminisce about her involvement with TIT TAT some of the things that she said were:

*“Some might consider the name to be a little strange, and wonder about the origin of the newsletter. Back in 1975 TLH Matron Selina Schiller (now a resident in Trinity Court) realised the need for a newsletter and set about establishing a regular, simple hand-written publication. Over the years, due mainly to advanced technology, the newsletter called TIT TAT has evolved into what is now - a much more sophisticated publication.”*

*“When I stepped in as Editor, I was provided with a computer, first in Pastor Maas’s Office, then I had a little nook in a TLH passage from which I worked. So I was now a newshound, with the interesting job of reporting and photographing events around the TLH complex and sharing interesting snippets.”*

*“The TLH office staff allowed me to use the photocopier outside of office hours. So I was able to set up the newsletter, print, staple and arrange delivery to residents at the end of each month. There were several impatient TLH resident hopefuls who waited every month for their copy, wanting to be the first to see the latest issue of TIT TAT. So this monthly routine was the norm for me - and my interstate children knew not to phone me near the end of the month! I’m thankful that my dear late husband Eric ( who passed away in 2009) was supportive of me in this role.”*

Getting TIT TAT out on time has been important to Dorcas - and she has made many personal sacrifices in trying to achieve that. She has a very, very keen eye as a proof-reader! The TIT TAT production team is in awe of her ability to seemingly find every last mistake in the publication - a skill which she no doubt had instilled into her when she did a secretarial course at High School. Readers with a keen eye will have detected that the high standard of copy sometimes now does not always pass the “Dorcas test” - but we try!

Dorcas has been the Hilda Schulz Drive representative on the TRL Residents' Committee for many years. Hilda Schulz Drive residents have been the recipients of many kindnesses from Dorcas. She makes new HSD residents feel welcome, recognises birthdays with a card - and balloons on letterboxes, and has been super-reliable in making sure that residents receive their mail-outs in a timely fashion. HSD residents have experienced the hospitality of Dorcas many times in her home. And of course, she has been a powerful advocate for TRL residents on the Residents' Committee. It goes without saying, that the accuracy of the minutes of the Committee meetings have benefitted from the proof-reading abilities of this special lady!







- ◆ Barossa Club is available for people from 65 years, living in the local community, who live independently in their home within the Barossa Valley region, including Independent Retirement Living.
- ◆ A referral (individuals meeting the criteria) from My Aged Care is required to attend Barossa Club.
- ◆ All that is needed is a simple telephone call to My Aged Care on 1800 200 422 or alternatively visit the My Aged Care website.
- ◆ The very helpful My Aged Care staff will explain all that is required and are happy to answer any questions that you may have.
- ◆ The opening times for Barossa Club are Monday to Friday 9.00am to 3.00pm and closed on weekends and public holidays.
- ◆ A delicious two course lunch meal prepared by the wonderful TLH Catering Team is available to enjoy in Barossa Club and the cost is \$7.00.
- ◆ A bus service for pick up and drop off to your door if you live in Tanunda, Angaston or Nuriootpa is available for \$5.80 (Concession Rate).
- ◆ A variety of activities are offered in the morning and afternoon, including social time during morning and afternoon tea.


