Assistant Chaplain's Reflection



Well, we are well and truly into winter now, having recently experienced some really freezing weather especially up in Angaston where I live. The seasons do roll on regardless of what ever else is happening in the world. I have experienced changes also this year, as I have been undertaking some formal chaplaincy training. I have been attending classes for 6 months, and like most students, I started in the classroom, but with the Great Plague making its presence felt, we moved online. But how very precious those final, fully present, classes were when we were able to gather again together! I have learnt a lot in the undertaking of these studies, and was sorely challenged at times also. Chief among the insights, has been the power of Active Listening. This means that one is fully present to the other person, without agenda, in what I call, a Deep Listening exercise. As chaplains we are unafraid of the deep places; we try to notice the important things that the other person is trying to communicate. We are unafraid of the silence.

The course had a strong focus on Reflective Practice, where we honestly consider what the other person really said, and was there evidence that there was more to the story at this point? And What is of value to the person at this time? It was great to be in a mixed group of fellow students in this course as we all brought something unique to the space. It was nice to be able to be really honest about ourselves and each other in a nonjudgmental space. And, as fallible humans, it is a precious thing when we are invited into the life of another, to bear witness of them.

The role of chaplain is to embrace the emotion that others try to avoid. We humans are deep creatures, and on occasion, we have need of the depths of others to support, and to comfort us. We need the deep presence of others to walk with us for a time during some of our more challenging days or weeks, or years. And as we all get older, what a lot of challenges we can face! And giving people a sense of belonging means they don't have to be "fixed up" before being accepted or embraced by us. We are all broken by life in some way or other, and nobody gets through life unscathed but the gentle care and kindnesses we show to one another along the way have great, even eternal, value. May you enjoy the mystery and joy of those you live and interact with on a daily basis.





Another Financial Year Gone By:

What a financial year Tanunda Lutheran Home (TLH) has had.

There has been good and bad news in the financial outcomes of the financial year. The good news is, overall TLH has had a reasonably good year. Our final end of year balance will be in the black again for the second year in a row.

The bad news is that as time goes by it is becoming harder to make ends meet whilst trying to meet the Standards. The current aged care funding system is not meeting the requirements to provide the increased levels of care of our residents in general deserve. With effects of the COVID-19 pandemic and the funding support from government TLH did well to come up with the little surplus achieved. As an organisation we now have a guaranteed stock of personal protection equipment (PPE) should there be another outbreak of the pandemic.

I would like to acknowledge the efforts of all TLH management staff for the way they have managed their budgets. I especially thank Cherie Cheyne and her team for the excellent work in making sure our finance system is well managed and meets the auditors requirements. It is also nice to have the continued support from the members of the TLH Board who ensure realistic budgets are approved for the business to use.

When reviewing some of our financial outcomes TLH has done very well with our ACFI funding being \$10.00 above the national average, our occupancy is eight percent above the national average and our staff sick leave and use of agency staff is well down as per previous years and is well under the national average. Thankyou to Sharon Berridge and the ACFI team, a big thankyou to Sharryn Hueppauff for ensuring we have residents in our available beds and for our staff coming to work and reducing our need to use agency staff.

How have you all coped with the changes in the COVID-19 pandemic process? At TLH we are now getting used to the very mobile playing field of the COVID-19 changes. At the moment we have access restrictions in place so everyone comes through the same door. This process will continue until we are sure the likelihood of another outbreak well and truly passes. We can not risk an outbreak of any sort in the Home. I do apologise to those who live in the village for the extra distance to travel to come inside but at this stage it cannot be helped.

The visitation process is now almost back to normal but we expect all visitors to the Home to make an appointment and ensure they have had their flu vaccination. There are to be only two visitors in the residents room. If you wish to take a resident out for a social event please ensure their safety and wellbeing by following the COVID-19 social distancing rules and ensure everyone is well – not suffering from a cold or flu. We do ask you follow our processes that will make sure everyone in the Home remains safe and well.

If there is a way you can all help to ensure TLH remains financially viable - that is we need to sell some of the new independent living units available in Nuriootpa and soon in Tanunda. Please, if you know of people you would like to join the TLH extended family, invite them in for a look and discussion with Carolyn Redden. Our units on Langmeil Road are coming along really well. Looking at a March 2021 finish date. We have units available to move into immediately in Nuriootpa – please come along and have a look.

Please remember to stay safe everyone and please wash & sanitize your hands

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH



As at **3:00pm on 18 June 2020**, a total of 7,391 cases of COVID-19 have been reported in Australia, including 102 deaths and 6,877 have been reported as recovered from COVID-19.

- Over the past week, there has been an average of 16 new cases reported each day. Of the newly reported cases, the majority have been from Victoria.
- Following the peak of cases at the end of March, since mid-April 2020 there has been a sustained and relatively low number of new cases reported daily.
- The overall proportion of cases under investigation in each state and territory is relatively low, indicating that public health actions, including case identification and contact tracing, is occurring in a timely manner.
- To date, over 1,927,000 tests have been conducted nationally. Of those tests conducted 0.4% have been positive.

World Elder Abuse Awareness Day

15 June was <u>World Elder Abuse Awareness Day</u>, a day designated by the United Nations for people around the world to voice their opposition to the abuse and suffering inflicted to our older generations.

The measures in place to help prevent elder abuse and protect the health, safety and wellbeing of senior Australians are even more important during uncertain and challenging times, such as now during the COVID-19 pandemic.

On 14 June 2020, Minister Colbeck announced the introduction of a Serious Incident Response Scheme (SIRS) for residential aged care from 1 July 2021.

The SIRS will expand the responsibilities of residential aged care providers in relation to identifying, recording, managing, resolving and reporting assaults and a broader range of serious incidents in residential aged care.

The SIRS will drive quality and safety improvements to residential aged care at the individual service and broader system level. The SIRS will be administered by the Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission.

Earlier this week the Minister for Health declared aged care free of COVID19. Just a day after this we had a new positive case in a facility in Melbourne. This will be our new normal. We are going to have to learn to live with and manage COVID risks for some time to come.

Further easing of restrictions is occurring with Queensland and Tasmania Directives changing their guidance on aged care visitors. We are anticipating changes to the national guidelines to occur shortly too.

This will also mean change and review for the Industry Code for Visiting Residential Aged Care Homes during COVID-19. We have all been working on FAQs on the Code and will keep you informed as this work progresses.

None of this changes in any way the great work the sector has done under immense pressure, keeping residents and staff safe and avoiding the devastating impacts of the pandemic that we have seen overseas.

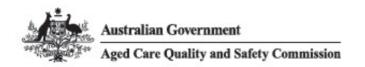

MEET Glenis Kupke - Bridge Street





Glenis at her much loved pianola

Glenis Kupke is a well-known member of the TLH community - she has lived here since 2013. Glenis and her late husband Darrell moved to Tanunda from Cleve. when Darrell suffered a debilitating stroke in 2013, after which he required a level of care which made it necessary for him to move to residential care at TLH. Glenis first lived in a unit in Schiller Court, and later in Bridge Street so that she could be near Darrell and help to care for him.

Glenis has had a full and interesting life, some of which she has written down - and this TIT TAT article about her can only skim the surface of what she has done in her life. Glenis was born in Blyth in 1940, the third of five children of Cliff and Erna Schumacher, and she lived with her parents on the family farm at Kybunga (between Balaklava and Clare) until she married in 1965.

She went to school at Kybunga Primary and Concordia College in Adelaide. Kybunga had a single class-room one teacher school. She was the only student in her class for the last couple of years, and the next oldest girl in the school was in Year Four. The Schumacher's lived four miles from the school, so Glenis and her two elder siblings drove themselves to school by horse and cart - often racing with the neighbour's children who also travelled in another horse and cart. Later she caught the school bus, which at that time was a truck, with wooden seats under a covered canopy mounted on the tray of truck - in the summer the cover of the canopy was rolled up and the kids would lean out and grab leaves from passing trees. Later they had a panel van as a bus. At school Glenis remembers playing Red Rover, French cricket, mothers and babies in make-believe houses under the trees.

Moving to Concordia College from a small country school was exciting. Initially she boarded in the Hostel which was about a mile from the College. The boarders had to walk from the Hostel to the College and back twice a day (lunch was at the Hostel) in a line they called "the crocodile." They had a senior girl who was the "room prefect" who sometimes tried to bribe her room-mates to do jobs for her - but Glenis never succumbed to that! Later she boarded at the Annexe which was close to the College - it had an advantage because the girls could watch the

boys ride past on their bikes! Glenis was part of the dance troupe which performed on the Wayville Showground for Queen Elizabeth when she visited in 1954. Glenis enjoyed her two years at Concordia College and began playing the piano then - and she still does that!

When Glenis left Concordia, he father purchased a piano accordion for her and she began to play the organ for church - something she is still doing - but now it is the piano and organ. She had some piano and singing lessons from a teacher who travelled to Blyth. remembers at one of the concerts given by the teacher's students she was so nervous that she got lost during the piece that she was playing. so she made up a suitable ending, bowed and walked off the stage, the together for church, concerts teacher was not impressed!

After College she helped out on the family farm with housework, looking after the hens and turkeys, milking cows, sheep work and sometimes driving the tractor and the truck. A few times she drove a truck load of lambs to the abattoirs - unusual for a girl back then. Later when she was still at home she got a job at Clare Kindergarten where her music skills were useful - she found that rewarding and often wishes that she had trained earlier for that work.

Glenis has played table tennis, and tennis. She was an active member of the church Luther League and was involved in games evenings, debates, speechmaking, play nights and socials attending these in many parts of SA. Her father bought her a Holden Ute so that she could get

around - and later she had a Volkswagen.

In her travels she met Darrell Kupke who lived at Yandiah near Booleroo Centre. They had known each other and been friends for many years, and then romance blossomed in 1962 - he also had a Volkswagen! They married in Blyth Lutheran Church in 1965. Darrell had worked on the family farm at Yandiah until then, but decided to join the stock firm Farmers Union. Darrell's first job with Farmers Union was in Adelaide - Glenis had seven weeks to organise a wedding so that they could move to Adelaide together - she made it!

Darrell worked in a number of locations for Farmers Union - McLaren Vale, Wirrabara, Lock, Bordertown and finally Cleve - where they lived for twenty-nine

years, the longest place in which Glenis has lived. The houses that they had to live in were sometimes not all that good - Glenis and Darrell became quite expert at "cutting and pasting" their floor coverings to fit the variety of rooms in these houses.

Glenis, besides being a wife and mother, has turned her hands to many things: Millinery course (Booleroo Centre), volunteer kindergarten teacher (Lock), assisting Darrell in the Farmers Union branch (Lock), working in an aged care hostel (Bordertown and Cleve) - her life experiences are many and varied. Glenis has been a generous contributor to her church and community.

In 2013, whilst in Cleve, Darrell suffered a stroke. After four months of rehabilitation in Adelaide, Glenis realised that he was going to need more care than she could provide, and so he moved to residential care at TLH. From that time until Darrell sadly passed away in January 2020, Glenis was able to spend most of every day with him, assisting in his care.



In earlier years Glenis and Darrell, with their family, caravanned to many places in SA, Victoria and WA. In their retirement they travelled all over Australia in this "heritage" caravan. During retirement they also enjoyed some overseas travel in between social bowls and lots of volunteering in the church and the community.





- Barossa Club is a social support group funded by the Commonwealth Home Support Program (CHSP).

- A referral (individuals meeting the criteria) from My Aged Care is required to attend Barossa Club.



THL Resident Rhonda Steinberner


Rhonda was invited as a guest to the Barossa Chateau Queens Rose Garden in March of 2002.
