

As I sit here in my office having just read an email stating that the Royal Commission into the Aged care Quality and Safety has been handed to the Governor General of Australia I ponder about the future of the aged care industry. The Final Report is the culmination of 28 months of work, including 23 public hearings involving 641 witnesses. Over 10,500 public submissions were received. Tanunda Lutheran Home was one of those submissions.

The main things I believe that will come from the royal commission are: changes to the Aged Care Act is to bring in a Human Rights element, there will be more administrative burden on facilities to ensure all residents and their families are provided with resident centred care and services and more will be directed to support people waiting for home care and services.

Tanunda Lutheran Home is prepared to accept any changes being suggested in the very near future. Our application to become an approved home care provider will enable us to provide services to residents of the retirement villages and other in the Barossa Region. Our residents already receive care and services within the resident centred care model and we have systems in place to ensure the quality of care and safety of our residents are monitored.

At a small celebration to recognise the completion of some or the new retirement units held Thursday 25th February 2021 both the Mayor – Bim Lange OAM and Bishop David Altus spoke very passionately about the services Tanunda Lutheran home has provided over the last 70 plus years. They also have noted the increased vision of the services to be provided into the future. Chris Pfeiffer also spoke about the great staff we have the pleasure of working with. Everyone puts in a lot of effort to meet the needs of the residents and the organisation in times when change has occurred very rapidly. The new units and other projects planned will see Tanunda Lutheran Home increase its profile with the Barossa Region. It is great to see the sales of retirement units increasing – welcome to all of our new residents, we hope you settle in quickly.

To provide a general update on the COVID-19 situation we are at the stage of now waiting for our vaccinations. The Home has been notified vaccinations for the residents in the Home will occur during the week commencing 1 March 2021. Please remember accepting to have the vaccinations is Voluntary. I encourage everyone to do their own research, talk to your GPs, be careful with what is reported in the media – especially within social media. We remain free of any flu and COVID-19 issues throughout the Home. Staff training in infection control continues.

The result of our Announced visit by the Regulators of the Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission has been received – Tanunda Lutheran Home is now fully compliant with all standards and outcomes. There has been a lot of team work to meet this outcome special mention to Kim Hahn, Sharon Berridge and Lisa Morrison for their outstanding efforts to make this all happen. We are now working very tirelessly to ensure our self-assessment is completed on time to commence our three yearly accreditation survey late in the year.

A big shout out to everyone – Tanunda Lutheran Home has plenty of employment opportunities. If you are aware of anyone looking for work please refer them to our website and complete an application. Having the correct qualifications and clearances are necessary to work in an aged care facility. The more staff we have the workloads can be shared. We would love to have more volunteers as well - again clearances are necessary but we can help with those. To all the new staff who have joined the team in the last month – welcome and thank you for choosing to work with us and our residents.

As I mentioned last month Robots are coming into the Home to assist staff with day to day tasks so as to free staff to do more care related care and resident activities. At this stage we are hoping to commence very soon altering some doors around the Home to assist the movement of the Robots about the facility. Also, just to confirm – this Robot Project is totally funded by a successful Grant received from the federal government. Tanunda Lutheran Home will be the first aged care facility to have Robots assisting staff. Something to be proud of.

LASA acknowledges the National Cabinet's announcement today that there are no current plans to make COVID-19 vaccination mandatory for aged care workers or residents. National Cabinet agreed the interim AHPPC advice on COVID vac- LEADING AGE SERVICES cination and aged care facilities.



The voice of aged care

The Australian Health Protection Principal Committee (AHPPC) has provided advice that state and territory public health orders should not be utilised to require the COVID-19 vaccine for aged care workers at this point.

There is currently a lack of evidence regarding effectiveness at preventing transmission and there is not yet a clear date by which all residents, staff, visitors and carers will have had an opportunity to be vaccinated.

Mandatory vaccinations are not new to aged care as we have had these in place for influenza vaccinations at times. So the AHHPC will continue to monitor the situation and will reconsider this matter and provide advice once further evidence becomes available.

Currently, AHPPC believes that Commonwealth and jurisdictional efforts should focus on communications to strongly encourage community uptake, which is expected to be high.

The Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI) has published advice on the relative timing of administering influenza and COVID-19 vaccines.

The Department of Health has also published information from the TGA about the process for assessing and approving COVID-19 vaccines.

#### New sign language interpreting service

From November 2020, older Australians who are deaf, deafblind, or hard of hearing, and who do not have access to interpreting services through aged care programs or the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS), can access free sign language interpreting services for daily activities such as: Family/social events, banking, moving/selling house, dealing with agencies/advisors etc.

These services are available face-to-face and by video remote.

Sign language services for deaf consumers or consumers who are hard of hearing are available in:

Auslan

American Sign Language

International Sign Language

Signed English

Tactile signing and hand over hand interpreting is available for deafblind consumers.

#### **Access these services**

Clients will need to contact Auslan Connections in advance. Once registered you will receive a Department of Health booking code which can be used each time they book an interpreting service. Bookings can be made via the Auslan Connections <u>website</u> or by calling 1300 010 877.

Bookings should be made in advance when possible to ensure the availability of an interpreter.

#### **Further information**

Each client can access an average of 40 hours of interpreting services per year. Over the next six months usage will be monitored. A cap may be applied in the 2021-22 financial year.

Deaf or hard of hearing clients who are over 65 won't be required to receive an aged care assessment if they are seeking to access interpreting services.

This new arrangement is in addition to the sign language interpreting services for older Australians who are receiving or want to access aged care services, as <u>announced</u> by the Minister on 17 June 2020.





We have been really pleased to see staff, visitors and Independent living residents support this initiative and have also donated their bottle tops.


A few important points — Please ensure that all bottle tops are clean and are not soiled

- Large flavour milk tops


