## Chaplain's Reflection



It's been encouraging seeing how residents throughout TLH have fared in the latest COVID-19 lockdown. Most people have looked across the fence, so to speak, and realized things could have been a lot worse for us if not for good leadership, decisive action, the assurance that things will get better soon, and a pat on the back when we've done the right thing. I guess we can cope with most things if these ingredients are in the picture, and residents will naturally feel some pride that they've got through without too much distress.

A little setback does invite the question of how we'd go in a really big setback, like if we were in Sydney right now. Some of you have certainly suffered truly heart-breaking traumas in your life, and these have had a big effect on your faith. ### Lutheran Home Inc. SECOND DOSE COVID-19 VACCINE CLINICS IN RESIDENTIAL AGED CARE 99% COMPLETE

As at 25 June 2021, over 309,000 COVID-19 vaccine doses have been administered in 2,566 residential aged care facilities receiving in-reach clinics through the Commonwealth's roll out in aged care.

Second dose vaccination clinics have been held in 99 per cent of facilities, with the remaining clinics scheduled for completion within the recommended interval between doses.

#### MANDATING OF COVID-19 VACCINATION FOR AGED CARE

The Department of Health has issued an eAlert providing further details of the approach to the mandating of vaccination for residential aged care workers.

This confirms the deadline for vaccination as 17 September. LASA has sought clarification of the detail of the public health orders to bring this into effect.

This includes confirmation that all residential aged care workers, irrespective of age, will be offered the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine. LASA notes that availability of Pfizer through all the identified channels varies over time.

There are some details about who will be captured in this requirement such as volunteers and those who are responsible for resident care, support and services as well as those who access, or are reasonably likely to access any premises for the administration of the service. We are seeking greater clarity on this.

LASA notes the inclusion of details of the existing channels, not all of which are available to all providers (such as the roving clinics and SONIC hubs) and we continue to advocate for an effective, efficient and safe roll out to the residential aged care workforce.

The Department includes material for sharing with staff and further encourages staff to access the <u>eligibility checker</u> to ascertain access at the local level.

#### COVID-19 VACCINATION REPORTING REQUIREMENTS EXTENDED FOR RESIDENTIAL AND HOME CARE PROVIDERS

The Australian Government has introduced new COVID-19 vaccination reporting requirements for residential and in-home aged care providers.

The expanded reporting is necessary to identify the potential level of risk each aged care service faces in the context of a COVID-19 outbreak in residential, in-home and community settings. It will inform how those services, residents and workers can best be supported.

While the new reporting requirements start on **27 July 2021**, all providers are encouraged to start reporting voluntarily now.

Details of the reporting requirements on COVID-19 vaccination for aged care providers is available on the Department's website - Reporting requirements on the COVID-19 vaccination status of aged care workforce.

#### Changes to residential aged care reporting

**Starting on 27 July 2021**, it will become a formal requirement for residential aged care providers to report weekly on the COVID-19 vaccination status of residents through the online <a href="My">My</a> <a href="My">Aged Care provider portal</a>. This is in addition to the current reporting on workforce vaccination.

The tool records de-identified data on the:

- total number of residents and workers at each aged care service and, of those,
- the number of residents and workers who have received a first dose of a COVID-19 vaccine the number of residents and workers who have received all required doses of a COVID-19 vaccine.

The purpose of the new reporting requirement is to provide greater health security for residents in their care. It is especially important for all residential aged care facilities to report weekly on the COVID-19 vaccination status of new residents to ensure ongoing vaccine access for this vulnerable group of senior Australians.






#### Chairs (normal chair) -




