Chaplain's Reflection



Slow Trains

On my way to work recently, on the lookout for cheap petrol, I took a different route and got stuck at a level crossing with a very slow and very long train coming through. At first I was cranky about the hold up. But then I relaxed, sat back and watched the show. Over 100 very old and very graffiti laden carriages rumbled by, and some of that art was very good. It was like being in a gallery with endless works of art moving by, and they passed at a speed where I could enjoy each one, marveling at the skill of the artists. And all I had to do

marveling at the skill of the artists. And all I had to do was stay in the warmth of my car and enjoy this gift.

The graffiti-laden carriages were also a gift, because they provided me with another metaphor for moving into aged care. Moving into aged care is inevitably an enforced slow-down, where the old body inevitably pins you to the wall and says: "You aint going anywhere mate".

At first the slow-down, the interruption to one's life, seems pointless and ridiculous to some. But then you start to notice different things as you ponder the new life situation. Some of the things you notice may be the things you hated, or thought very ugly, which you now start to see with a new appreciation. And some of the things you thought were beautiful and life-giving are not available anymore and need to be grieved.

In an ultimate sense we may imagine God as the celestial train driver. He drops the boom gates down. He stops us in our tracks. And then he begins to show us new things, things which first may look ugly, like the enforced vulnerability at the hands of young staff, the routines and company which we would have run a

hundred miles from just 5 years ago. And we begin to see beauty in these things. Life is renewed in a way we least expect it. And all we have to do is open our eyes, or our other senses if the eyes don't work so well anymore.

Believing God really cares is always a challenging act of trust. The invitation is to sit back, open your eyes (and your heart) and see what comes next. You'll probably be surprised.

Happy Spring everyone. Is it nice to see some sunshine and feel the warmth of the sun on our face again. There has been a reasonable amount of rain which has turned the Barossa Valley very green.

To all the DADs – Happy Father's Day on the 5th September – may you all be spoilt by your children no matter what age they are. Have a great day.

To the CROWS Supporters – there is always next year. To the POWER Supporters – let's hope the Grand Final Cup comes to South Australia. May the best team win on the day.

I would like to acknowledge the great work our government here in South Australia have done in keeping us safe and free of the COVID-19 pandemic. Please join with me to keep the other states in our thoughts and prayers for all to keep safe during these testing times. There is no fun in being in a lockdown situation for so long.

Here at Tanunda Lutheran Home (TLH) all is going well. The new executive team have settled in well. They are getting on with the job at making TLH a better place. We received the news from the Aged Care Regulators that our accreditation has been extended for another six months which means our three-year survey will not occur until 2022.

We have again seen the long serving staff move on to other opportunities. Anne White our Podiatrist after nearly 12 years has decided she needs to slowdown and Mandy Fletcher who has managed rosters and other various roles in her over 17 years has moved to take on a more senior role in another aged care facility. Both staff members have be farewelled with lots of food, gifts, and the card. A Podiatrist will be contracted to provide these services to our residents into the future. Shaedell from reception has accepted the fulltime role in Rostering and admin support.

As the year is moving along, we are dealing with more change in the way aged care is provided. With assistance of the pharmacist and doctors we have introduced new policies to do with reducing the use of antibiotics, overall medications and reduction in the use of antipsychotic medications. In an area to ensure safety of our residents TLH no longer uses bed rails on our beds. We use practices that are less restrictive for the resident. All residents with an assessed falls risk are monitored and care plans are reflective of current practices needed to reduce falls.

Over the past week I have had the pleasure of meeting our new Board Member – Mark Kleemann. Mark is a Lutheran Paster who has just retired from service with the Airforce as a Chaplain. He lives locally and was born in Tanunda – so it makes him a true local. Please join me in welcoming Mark into the TLH family.

As can be seen around the villages, construction continues, our units on Langmeil Road – expected completion date is now November 2021 – lots happening on the site. Please remember the construction area is a NO ENTRY zone for residents and families. The construction of a further five units at Nuriootpa will commence very soon. For the residents and families who reside or visit Trinity Court there will be some re-construction work happening around the two glassed areas to stabilize the ceilings.

It's September, that means the ROBOTS are still coming. The robots are coming from America, travelling through Sydney to arrive in Adelaide. With the COVID-19 issue we are not sure when the arrival date will be at this stage. I will ensure I keep you all informed. Some building work is required throughout the home to ensure the doorways are all automated and wide enough for ease of movement of the robots and placement of various trolleys.

Over the coming weeks I will be away on a period of sick leave. I am finally having surgery on my aching back to assist in reducing my chronic pain. To all those who have supported me over the past months by checking up on me – thank you, it means a lot to me. In my absence Sharon Berridge will be the first point of call. She will have Rachel & Ameya assisting her. I do hope to be back in around three weeks' time depending on how it all goes.

NEW PUBLIC REPORTING OF RESIDENTIAL AGED CARE VACCINATION

Nationally as at 22 August, of the total 278,214 residential aged care workers reported to date by providers, 189,541 have received a first dose COVID-19 vaccine (68 per cent) and 130,405 are fully vaccinated (47 per cent).

An <u>interactive map</u> showing data on vaccination rates of residential aged care workers across Australia is being published today on the department's <u>website</u>.

The map displays data reported through the My Aged Care provider portal and will be updated weekly, in line with the mandatory reporting requirements for providers. The data does not

include exemptions for workers under public health orders at this time.

To protect the personal information of individuals – especially at smaller facilities — data is banded into ranges.

A facility's workforce vaccination rate will be displayed within a range, not as a specific number e.g. 90-100% of workers at this facility have at least one dose.

The band width is based on the number of workers at the residential aged care facility.

Larger percentage bands are used when reporting vaccination rates for residential aged care facilities with less than 20 staff.

Data for facilities with fewer than five staff is not included.

The map is compliant with privacy laws and policies relevant to the electronic publishing of health data.

Note that providers with very low vaccination rates appear to mainly be services with old data. Providers that have not updated their vaccination rates recently should do so as soon as possible

SA HEALTH - INFORMATION FOR RACFS ON MANDATORY COVID-19 VACCINATION

From 17 September 2021, all RACF staff, contractors and volunteers are required to have received at least one dose of a TGA approved COVID-19 vaccine and have evidence of a booking to receive, or have received, a second dose.

The <u>Information for Residential Aged Care Facilities fact sheet</u> has been updated to cover some of the more specific questions that have been raised by the sector over the past week. **Who is mandated?**

The requirement to receive a mandatory COVID-19 vaccination applies to people who are:

- Employed or engaged by or on behalf of a RACF (whether as an employee, contractor or agency staff) to work or perform duties at a premises of a RACF on a full time, part time or casual basis, including:
- **Direct care workers** (nurses; personal care workers; allied health professionals; and allied health assistants)
- **Administration staff** (reception; management; administration)
- Ancillary staff (food preparation; cleaning; laundry; garden; maintenance)
- Lifestyle / social care (music/art therapy)
- Transport drivers of residents of RACF

- Volunteers engaged by a RACF to undertake duties at a RACF
- Students on placement at a RACF; and
- **Medical practitioners and allied health professionals** who attend and provide care to residents of a RACF whether employed or engaged by the resident, RACF or another person.

Note: Under the South Australian RACF Emergency Management Direction, allied health professionals such as occupational therapists, physical therapists, speech language pathologists, etc. are mandated to receive COVID-19 vaccination, whether employed or engaged by the resident, RACF or another person.

Who is not mandated?

Some people who must enter a RACF to provide a service, are not mandated to receive a COVID -19 vaccination under the RACF Emergency Management Direction, however COVID-19 vaccination is strongly encouraged for anyone entering a RACF. The following people are not included int his Direction:

- In-reach services including AN-ACC/ACAT/RAS assessors, Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission field staff, Aged Care Advocates delivering the National Aged Care Advocacy Program (Older Persons Advocacy Network Members), trade union officials.
- Emergency services staff, including SA Ambulance Officers undertaking resident transport to/from hospital or providing treatment in a RACF.
- Contractors such as trades people, delivery drivers, hairdressers, librarians, solicitors, pastoral care workers / clergy.
- Volunteers who are not engaged by a RACF, for example community visitors providing companionship to a resident at the request of the resident.
- Family and friends of the resident.

What exemptions are in place and how are they granted?

In a limited number of circumstances, exemptions to the requirement for mandatory COVID-19 vaccination may apply.

Requests for temporary exemptions (not medical grounds or pregnancy) must be made in writing to the Department for Health and Wellbeing by email to <u>officeforageingwell@sa.gov.au</u>. Requests should include contact details and any information relevant to the request.

AGED CARE VACCINE ROLLOUT WEB PAGES UPDATED

<u>Department web pages</u> for aged care workers, providers and residents have been updated with the latest information on the rollout of COVID-19 vaccination for aged care.

Information covering how and where to get a vaccine, eligibility and accessibility is included as well as details on mandatory vaccination and related public health orders, and updated information on recording and reporting.

The newly-developed <u>mandatory vaccination page</u> includes links to the national framework endorsed by AHPCC, as well as public health orders issued by WA, SA, TAS, the NT and QLD.

Public health orders for other states and territories will be added as they are released. Fact sheet on accessing COVID-19 vaccination translated and now available in 19 languages.

A fact sheet describing how residential aged care workers can access a COVID-19 vaccination ahead of the 17 September deadline for mandatory vaccinations is now available in 19 languages other than English on the department website.






