Residents who put on a brave face to play bingo, sometimes after a really challenging night. Residents putting on a brave face as they approach end of life, hoping very much that the things they have believed through life will see them through in the end.

Families putting on a brave face to entrust their loved ones to our care – sometimes feeling like they've failed, that their hope of seeing their parent stay at home in the warm family embrace has not materialized.

Staff putting on a brave face to come to work when they are feeling a little down emotionally and the last thing they need is a difficult encounter in the workplace.

Aged care is an arena where lots of brave faces are seen right now – as we hold our breath hoping the quality agency people will see the loving intent of what we do, even if we don't always get everything right.

At the end of the day we all stay in aged care, where the pressures to leave seem to be growing, because we love the residents, and because a work of such profound service is good for the soul. At induction I always tell new staff that being here at TLH will have a rich spiritual effect on them, and they won't be the same people when they leave.

How can working with so many amazing people, staff and residents, not have a profound effect on us? Not sure if filling supermarket shelves gives as much personal pleasure or spiritual wealth!

God bless your brave face. He knows about putting on a brave face too.



Greetings everyone.

Someone mentioned to me the other day that it is 100 days to

Christmas. I do hope life as we know it now is keeping you all safe and well. Remember to do you Christmas shopping early.

Isn't the Barossa Valley a beautiful sight – the crops are looking great and the vines are coming back to life – bring on the next Vintage. How is everyone's gardens going? Spring has brought all plants alive and growing once again. My garden is looking good for produce this year – will be happy to share.

As I'm sure you have heard, I have spent a little time in hospital. I have after many years finally had a procedure completed on my back. My reflections of the whole process have given me a renewed sense of who I am and what I do. Being in pain is never a good thing – it restricts you in so many ways and drains you of energy. Agreeing to have the surgery was a big step. It meant a stay in hospital and time off work – both which are not things that I enjoy. The stay in hospital was an experience I'll never forget. Being totally in the care of the nursing and surgical staff, having tubes putting things in and out, the hospital food was okay, the environment was new. Receiving everyone's well wishes and being supported by my family was great. I now have a renewed faith in trusting those who are there helping me. I also believe that staff at TLH do great things when given the opportunity. I'm looking forward to getting back to work and continuing the journey of making TLH a better place.

Over the past couple of weeks, the new executive team of Sharon, Rachel and Ameya have done a great job in ensuring TLH continued to operate at the great level it does. There have been some difficult discussions with staff in ensuring everyone is vaccinated with the COVID Vaccine. I do acknowledge that the decision may not have been easy for some but as we know the government mandated that all aged care workers and volunteers must be vaccinated to work in aged care industry. Other tasks completed were the upgrade to the main kitchen and the replacement of dishwashers in the kitchenettes. Well done Hollie for making it all happen.

TLH has received the necessary documentation to now commence the construction of four (4) extra resident rooms in the ABG location. The GC&J Constructions have accepted the work, so we look forward to continuing our relationship with them. They're a nice bunch of blokes. A Grant of \$642,000.00 has been awarded to TLH by the Commonwealth Government to assist this project.

Construction continues at a rapid pace on our units on Langmeil Road – expected completion date is still late November 2021. Please remember the construction area is a NO ENTRY zone for residents and families. If you know anyone who would like to move into the Retirement Village, please refer them to Greg or Carolyn. The construction of a further five units at Nuriootpa has commenced.

For the residents and families who reside or visit the Trinity Court there will be some reconstruction work happening around the two glassed areas to stabilise the ceilings. Please take care when moving around in the area.

The Robots have landed in Sydney, they've been tested and are now waiting to be transported to us. I've been told maybe in the next couple of weeks. Please ensure you all assist in welcoming the Robots – we will have a ceremony to welcome them and decide what they will be named – have you put your suggestions forward yet?

Please remember, wear a mask wherever you go, wash your hands frequently and

use sanitizer often.

MANDATORY VACCINATION OF RESIDEN-TIAL CARE STAFF IS NOW IN EFFECT

More than 98 per cent of residential aged care workers nationwide have received a first dose of COVID-19 vaccine and 80 per cent are fully vaccinated. This outstanding result is testament to the incredible work of providers and facilities in supporting their workers to receive a COVID-19 vaccine, and to every worker's commitment to protect themselves, their families and the people in their care.

The latest rates of vaccination rates as of 20 September are as follows:

The accurate and timely reporting of data is critical to ensuring compliance with <u>state and</u> <u>territory public health orders</u>. The Department has advised that compliance activities will commence following analysis of data in the My Aged Care portal this week.

This **Department of Health Communique** explains the next steps for providers.

Ensure your workers receive their second dose vaccination

The focus of mandatory vaccination now shifts to second doses for all residential aged care workers. Providers, facility managers and/or IPC leads are responsible for ensuring workers receive a second dose by the deadlines specified in the respective <u>public health orders</u>. All facilities which received a first dose in-reach clinic for workers (delivered by Commonwealth vaccine providers, primary care providers or aged care providers) will receive a second dose clinic for workers onsite.

Commonwealth vaccine hubs will continue to operate to provide second dose clinics for workers and these details will be provided directly to facilities.

All other vaccination channels remain available for priority access for residential aged care workers to receive their second dose vaccination, including primary care clinics, pharmacies, Commonwealth vaccination clinics and state and territory run mass vaccination clinics.

Monitoring and compliance activities begin Wednesday

The Department will take a proactive approach in contacting facilities directly to:

- ensure continuity of resident care standards as a priority
- understand the reasons for non-medical exemptions or unvaccinated workers
- provide advice on the availability and access to a vaccine for unvaccinated workers
- provide advice on exemption requirements for the relevant state or territory public health order
- how to report exemptions correctly in the My Aged Care provider portal.
 If contacted, facilities will be required to advise the Department of their strategy for addressing

non-medical exemptions and increasing vaccination rates, including a plan to ensure all current workers not yet vaccinated receive a minimum first dose COVID-19 vaccine as soon as possible.

What happens next?

The Department will share information with the state or territory and, where relevant, make a recommendation on whether formal exemptions should apply (this is not an option in all jurisdictions).

The Department will also share information with the Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission for further action, including immediate referral where no appropriate strategy is identified by the facility and/or provider.

If strategies are not implemented to adequately minimize the risk of COVID-19 infection, including through workforce vaccination, the Commission may take action, including issuing sanctions. The relevant state or territory may then take compliance action or impose penalties where compliance with the relevant public health order is not achieved. These penalties are detailed in the state and territory public health orders.

Worker's vaccination status not showing on Australian Immunisation Register (AIR)?

This may be because the vaccine provider has not uploaded the person's vaccination record to the AIR. As a first step, providers can call the AIR on 1800 653 809 (8am-5pm AEST weekdays) and Human Services will prioritise update of the worker's vaccination record.

If your workforce was vaccinated on site by a Commonwealth vaccine provider, please contact the vaccine provider directly. You will need to provide the individual's full name, Medicare number and date of vaccination at your facility.

If a worker was vaccinated at an alternate site, such as a GP or state and territory run clinic, providers should assist their workers in contacting the vaccine provider and requesting the vaccination record be uploaded to their Immunisation History Statement.

DEMENTIA IN AUSTRALIA 2021 REPORT RELEASED

To coincide with Dementia Action Week (20–26 September), a new report into dementia has been released.

The <u>Dementia in Australia 2021 report</u> provides a comprehensive picture of dementia and its impacts on Australia's health and aged care systems.

Dementia is now the third-leading cause of disease burden in Australia. Up to 472,000 Australians are living with dementia, and more than half of people in residential aged care have dementia. Between 134,900 and 337,200 Australians are providing consistent unpaid care for a person with dementia.

The Australian Government is investing \$229.4 million to improve <u>care and services for people</u> living with dementia.

Key measures include:

- training for more than 3,000 personal care workers to become dementia leaders within their organisations and additional training places for 1,000 GPs and GP registrars each year
- an increase in early support services such as counselling and education to around 30,000 people living with dementia at home so they can remain independent increased availability of respite places.

The Dementia in Australia 2021 report is the first of its kind in almost 10 years and was prepared by the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare through funding from the Department of Health. 




TLH are working with the Grow Love community Gardens and sorting bottle tops for recycling.


Chairs (normal chair) -
