Making Music




Christian worship, which is an important part of the life of LHB, is a musical thing – perhaps because the most famous Old Testament King (David) wrote a lot of poetry (Psalms) and was himself a musician (played the Lyre). Music is also important because it is a great way to connect with the stories, feelings, themes and spirit of God’s love, even for people with advanced dementia.

Traditionally (well, for a few hundred years), and this is a Barossa thing too, a lot of music in churches gets played on pipe organs. We’ve just acquired one for the chapel. We put up our hand to be caretakers of the Australian Lutheran College chapel organ, which is surplus to their requirements as they relocate from the North Adelaide campus, and we were successful. It has cost us virtually nothing. The original benefactor of the organ to ALC even left them with a fund for relocation, and the costs of servicing the organ have been minimal.

This is a biggish organ, and packs a punch, but think Baby Grand rather than Bach Fugues. We’ve ensured this organ is the right size for our chapel.

There’s more stories to be told about this organ, and a lot of those stories will be told in the future as, over time, people identify the sound of the organ as one of the reminders of God’s love in this place. In the meantime we’ll need to plan a celebration. Boards and CEOs, as we recently



discovered, get ‘installed’. Baby organs get ‘christened’ no doubt. Do we name it as well? That might be going too far! Maybe one day.

STATEMENT OF RIGHTS:

The Australian Government is changing Australia's aged care laws. The Aged Care Act 2024 has a Statement of Rights. This explains what rights older people have when accessing aged care services funded by the Australian Government. The Statement of Rights will replace the current Charter of Aged Care Rights on 1 July 2025

What the Statement of Rights means for you:

The Statement of Rights will help make sure you are at the centre of your aged care. It gives you the right to:

- Make your own decisions about your own life
- Have your decisions not just accepted, but respected
- Get information and support to help you make decisions
- Communicate your wishes, needs and preferences
- Feel safe and respected
- Have your culture and identity respected
- Stay connected with your community

You have the right to:

- Independence, choice and control
- Fair access
- Safety and quality
- Respect for your privacy and information
- Communication that meets your needs
- Support to raise issues quickly and fairly
- Support and connection with people and community


ROBOTS








The residents were very excited to be visited from some of the special people from Faith Lutheran School.
