Robots with Heart - How Smart Helpers Are Supporting Aged Care Teams

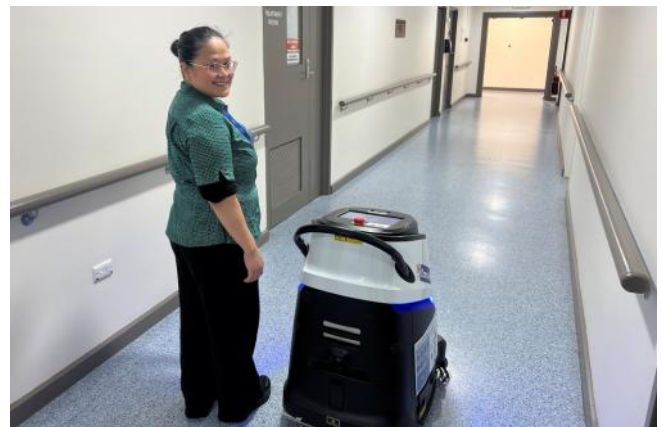
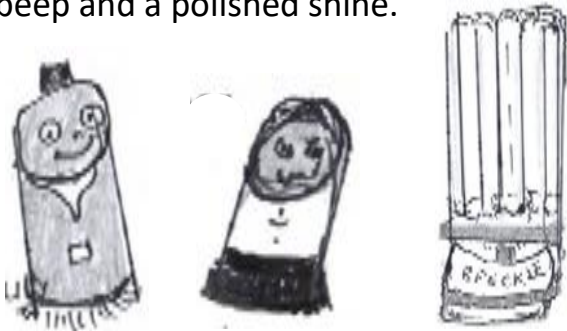
A new generation of cleaning robots is stepping in, quite literally to lend a helping wheel.
